How to get to MAI?

Map, Metro and Bus

MAI is located at 3680 Jeanne-Mance in Montreal. We're one block north of Prince-Arthur Street and one block from Avenue du Parc.

Metro

- Green line → Place-des-Arts station | 9 min walk
- Orange line → Sherbrooke station | 14 min walk

Bus

- Lines 129, 80 and 480


Avenue du Parc → Parc/Léo-Parizeau stop | 2 min walk

- Line 144

Avenue des Pins → Des Pins/du Parc stop | 2 min walk

- Line 24

Sherbrooke street → Sherbrooke/Jeanne-Mance stop | 7 min walk



How to get to MAI?

Parking

MAI has no parking facilities.

Three parking spaces are reserved for people with reduced mobility. There are a few spaces in the streets around the theatre. Two paid parking lots are located nearby.

We recommend that you arrive 30 minutes early to find a spot and have time to quietly enter the theatre.

MAI (Montréal, arts interculturels) presents shows and events featuring multidisciplinary and intercultural arts.



Box Office


If you're visiting MAI, you may need a ticket for your event. To pick up your tickets, go to the box office on your right as you enter the building.

Café-bar atmosphere

There may be many people around during your visit, and other times, there may be just a few. Before a show begins, the Café-bar may fill up with people. The Café is a safe place to be. If you feel the need to leave the show for whatever reason, you may sit in the Café. During the show, the Café will be quieter and you can ask for assistance from the Front of House Manager if you feel the need.

Drinks and snacks

Drinks and snacks are available in the Café-bar. It is possible to eat and drink during the show.



Washrooms and Coat check

When you are facing the bar counter, washrooms will be to your right. (Washrooms contain accessible stalls but they are not automatic.) You are free to use the self-service coat check.

Theatre / Performance Hall

The entrance to the theatre is in the Café-bar.

The stage or seating may look different from one show to the next. You can choose where to sit, there is no assigned seat on your ticket.

If you need to leave the theatre during the show, you can use the main door to go to the Café. There, you can take time to relax if you need a break before returning to the theatre. You can go back into the theatre whenever you are ready.

Gallery / Showroom





Quiet Area

There is a calm space waiting for you in the Café.

There you will find pictures to colour, as well as anti-stress balls and weighted stuffed animals. You can also help yourself to snacks and beverages. The Café is a place where you can relax and take a little break before returning to the gallery.

Someone from the MAI team is available at all times to help you get to where you need to go.
